Recipe of the Month: Jalapeno Poppers!

Ingredients:

- 4 ounces reduced fat cream cheese
- 1 tablespoon grated Parmesan cheese 1 teaspoon garlic powder

3/4 cup shredded reduced fat mozzarella cheese

8 large jalapeño peppers

8 pieces, thinly sliced bacon, cut in half

Directions:

- Preheat oven to 425 degrees F.
- In a small bowl, mix together the cream cheese, Parmesan cheese, garlic powder and mozzarella cheese.

• Wash peppers and cut off stems. Cut peppers lengthwise to make 16 halves. You may want to wear plastic gloves while handling hot peppers.



- Scrape out the seeds and membrane of each pepper.
- Stuff each pepper half with the cream cheese mixture and wrap each stuffed pepper with a half piece of bacon.
- Lightly grease a broiler pan or pan with a rack. This will allow any grease to fall away from the poppers.
- Bake for 20 minutes or until poppers are hot and juicy and the bacon is browned.

IN 4-E PHOTOGRAPHY, STUDENTS WILL EXPLORE THE FUNDAMENTALS OF PHOTOGRAPHY, AND EE EQUIPPED WITH THE SKILLS AND CONFIDENCE TO CAPTURE COMPELLING IMAGES IN VARIOUS SETTINGS. THROUGH A HANDS-ON APPROACH, THIS COURSE COMEINES CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION WITH OUTDOOR PRACTICE, OFFERING STUDENTS A COMPREHENSIVE LEARNING EXPERIENCE.

STUDENTS WILL LEARN HOW TO OPERATE THEIR GAMERAS, AND MASTER MANUAL AND AUTOMATIC MODES WHILE UNDERSTANDING KEY SETTINGS SUCH AS APERTURE, SHUTTER SPEED, ISO, AND WHITE BALANCE. THEY WILL EXPLORE COMPOSITIONAL TECHNIQUES LIKE THE EULE OF THIRDS, LEADING LINES, FRAMING, AND SYMMETRY, AS WELL AS LEARN TO ANALYZE AND UTILIZE NATURAL AND ARMIFICIAL LIGHT.

THESE GESSIONS OFTEN INCLUDE LIVE DEMONSTRATIONS AND DISCUSSIONS TO REINFORCE THEORETICAL CONCEPTS. STUDENTS WILL BE CIVEN OPPORTUNITIES IN EVERY CLASS TO APPLY THEIR SKILLS BY EXPERIMENTING WITH DIFFERENT PHOTOGRAPHY STYLES SUCH AS LANDSCAPES, PORTRAITS, MACRO PHOTOGRAPHY, TOY PHOTOGRAPHY, TABLETOP PHOTOGRAPHY, EVENT PHOTOGRAPHY, AND ACTION SHOTS. STUDENTS WILL DEVELOP SKILLS IN ADAPTING TO CHANGING LIGHT CONDITIONS, FRAMING DYNAMIC SCENES, AND EMPLOYING CREATIVE TECHNIQUES LIKE DEPTH OF FIELD AND MOTION BLUR.

THIS CLASS ALSO INTRODUCES BASIC POST-PROCESSING TECHNIQUES USING PHOTO-EDIMING SOFTWARE, ENABLING STUDENTS TO ENHANCE THEIR IMAGES EFFECTIVELY. INTERACTIVE ASSICNMENTS AND CONSTRUCTIVE FEEDBACK WILL BE PART OF ALL CLASSES TO HELP PARTICIPANTS BUILD THEIR CREATIVE VISION AND TECHNICAL EXPERTISE. THE ULTIMATE COAL OF THIS CLASS IS TO PROVIDE AN ATMOSPHERE WHERE STUDENTS WILL HAVE A SOLID FOUNDATION TO PURSUE PHOTOGRAPHY AS A REWARDING HOBBY OR A STEPPING STONE TOWARD PROFESSIONAL WORK.

Livestock Exhibitors: All youth livestock participants must have a total of 6 education hours by their species validation date! All Market Animal exhibitors must go through the Market Animal Validation Process, Validation Forms must be filled out by the Youth, Parents, and Agent prior to attending a Validation Site. Validation date information will be available in February. BeefCattle Exhibitors: Kentucky Beef Expo in March will be a Validation Site for Market Steers/Heifers, all validation paperwork must be completed before attending.

Shooting Sports Participants: All Shooting Sports Participants must have 6 hours of safety education before being able to participate in practices or competitions. Safety Hours can be obtained at the Monthly meetings from January-March. Youth interested in participating in Shooting Sports do not need to have their own equipment at the beginning. For those who want to try it out, you will be able to borrow club equipment.
